The Parker River National Wildlife Refuge and surrounding area is one of the best places along the Atlantic Coast to view shorebirds. During the spring, many of these magnificent birds stop briefly at the refuge to accumulate fat reserves---the fuel they need to continue their flights to northern breeding areas. A few species stop at the refuge to establish territories and breed. In the late summer and fall, most species take a more leisurely pace as they move through our area to southern wintering grounds. August and September are great times to view these amazing migrants on the refuge.

During his PowerPoint presentation over Zoom, Bill Gette, President of the Friends of Parker River NWR, will show his shorebird photographs, describe the many aids to field identification, discuss each species' feeding strategy, and review migration patterns.
